1. Introduction

The purpose of this Act is to address and resolve persistent issues within Sarovian colleges. As the Director of the Kiev Staff College (KSC), I am acutely aware of these challenges and their implications for the broader educational system. Sarovian colleges play a pivotal role in the Empire, and it is imperative to eliminate these issues to ensure their continued success and contribution to the Empire's progress.

2. Primary Issue

The primary issue affecting all colleges is a pervasive sense of "laziness." This issue is exacerbated by excessive bureaucracy, which slows down administrative processes and indirectly fosters inactivity. Together, these factors undermine the effectiveness and success of the colleges.

Imperial Military College

At the Imperial Military College (IMC), there has been a noticeable increase in cadet reluctance to fulfill degree requirements during the week. Additionally, it has come to light that some cadets fail to submit their weekly progress reports, a critical tool for Directors to evaluate cadet activities and assess their development relative to prior reports.

To address these concerns, the following measures will be implemented:

- a) The appointment of the Commandant, Directors, and all other officials at IMC will be conducted by the Minister of Education;
- b) Both the Commandant and the Minister of Education will have the authority to grade all IMC examinations; and
- c) A new system will be introduced to dismiss cadets who fail to consistently submit their progress reports.

These changes are designed to streamline administrative processes, ensure accountability, and maintain high standards within KSC, thus improving its overall efficiency and effectiveness.

4. Ironwood Military Academy

While Ironwood Military Academy faces fewer issues, there is a notable problem with some instructors failing to fulfill their duties. To remedy this:

- a) All officers and warrant officers are required to join the Ironwood Academy unless they are granted an exemption for legitimate reasons, such as insufficient time; and
- b) The Ironwood Academy will be jointly supervised by the Army General Staff and the Minister of Education to ensure proper preparation of instructors and the delivery of quality sessions.

5. Falkenholm College

Falkenholm College suffers from severe inactivity, with its ranks filled by members who are no longer engaged or affiliated with the nation. The lack of active leadership is a significant contributing factor.

To address this issue:

- a) His Imperial Majesty, the Emperor, will be promoted to the rank of Chancellor of Falkenholm College, or another title of his choosing, retaining his role as the formal head of the college;
- b) The Minister of Education and the Prime Minister will also be granted administrative powers to assist His Imperial Majesty in managing the college. If deemed necessary, their powers may be lesser but similar;
- c) The Minister of Education will have the authority to appoint graduates of Falkenholm College as Provosts. Provosts will possess the same administrative powers as the Minister and the Prime Minister to help manage the college; and
- d) The Minister may appoint as many Provosts as necessary to ensure efficient leadership and guidance,

Through these reforms, this Act seeks to resolve the issues plaguing Sarovian colleges and ensure their continued role as vital institutions within the Empire.

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
