An Act relating to the Saro-Gralat Exchange and Payment of Farmers.

1. Short Title	This Act shall be known as the <i>Farmers Act</i> in short.
2. Preamble	The primary method of generating gralats within Estos is through farming, traditionally no formal legislation has been enacted to protect farmers and offer better compensation to individuals who generate gralats for the "Saro-Gralat" exchange. This bill seeks to do this.
3. Organising Authority	The Saro-Gralat exchange allows all citizens to exchange their Saros for gralats, to purchase uniforms, hats, or anything they wish to purchase. The Saro-Gralat Exchange is to be organised by the Minister of Finance, and can be delegated to other individuals. The Minister of Finance is to set maximum exchange limits, based on the availability of gralats. Individuals can be barred from the exchange by the Prime Minister, for any reason.
4. Union of Farmers	Any and all farming for the government should be carried out by The Imperial Union of Farmers. The Imperial Union of Farmers is in charge of ensuring farmers and the government can work together effectively to achieve the best possible exchange. The Imperial Union of Farmers will protect and ensure the wellbeing of farmers. The Imperial Union ensures that all farmers communicate the amount of gralats within their farms. The Imperial Union should clearly communicate and set targets they want achieved. 7 days worth of rest should be given to farmers after an exchange. In extraordinary circumstances, this resting period can be cancelled.
5. Rewards and Payment	The government will guarantee certain bonuses for farmers. Farmers who exchange over 5,000 gralats may be awarded 500Sr as a bonus. The percentage of pay for farmers is to be seventy five percent of the gralats being exchanged.
6. Exchange Organisation	The Saro-Gralat Exchange has often been organised poorly. This act will aim to ensure a more coordinated process is in place so the exchanges are less impacted by disruptions.
	The Minister or individual appointed to organise the exchange, must begin calculating the gralats available for the exchange 48 hours from the exchange date. 24 or 48 hours from the exchange date, the individual in charge must begin announcing the exchange and taking orders. All orders are to be kept track on through a spreadsheet provided by the Ministry of Finance. Orders must state which farms will be used. The individual in charge must also ensure that the appropriate number of orders are taken, and limits are in place to ensure orders can be fulfilled.
